

1. What is the implementation date for the latest ASRT curriculum?

The JRCERT Board of Directors adopted the revised curriculum at the April 2007 meeting. The implementation date is September 1, 2008.

2. Which cohort of students, i.e. the graduating class of 2010, does the curriculum need to be developed and implemented for?

The new curriculum must be in place for those students beginning the program on or after September 1, 2008.

3. Would college credit earned from passing “College Level Examination Program” (CLEP) testing be accepted as meeting the general education requirements?

The directors believe that college credit earned from College Level Examination Program (CLEP) testing, as well as any high school courses that result in college credit, would be acceptable.

4. Would college remedial courses in English and math be acceptable?

It is the opinion of the directors that the courses would be acceptable if the credit earned from these courses could be used towards completion of a degree.

5. Do students need to complete a course in both English and speech to satisfy the “Written/oral communication” requirement?

The intent of the “Written/oral communication” requirement is that any one course in either written or oral communication is acceptable. This is also the same for “Math/logical reasoning.” Please be advised that there must be a minimum of 15 credit hours of general education coursework. Written/oral communication and mathematical/analytical studies are required to satisfy a portion of the 15 hour requirement. The ASRT curriculum does not prescribe the number of hours to be taken in any particular category.

6. If a course in the general education curriculum is identified as a pre-requisite for the program, could the course be counted as meeting a portion of the 15 credit hour general education requirement?

Yes, a course taken prior to admission to the program could be counted toward the general education requirement. General education courses can be taken either as a pre-requisite or a co-requisite.
