## Sharing Clinical Education Settings

Recently there has been a dramatic increase in the number of inquiries regarding the use of a clinical education setting by more than one educational program. Many programs have expressed concerns that the use of a clinical education setting by more than one program jeopardizes appropriate student supervision, student capacity, and the general effectiveness of the site. Although it is the prerogative of the clinical education setting to be associated with more than one educational program, many programs continue to have concerns regarding this issue. Based on these concerns, the Board of Directors at the April 2003 Committee meeting developed the following policy:

11.604B maintains STANDARDS providing that programs apply for recognition of clinical education settings.

ii. Requires the new program to submit documentation of a meeting when a program applies for recognition of a site already recognized for another accredited program. This meeting must include an

official from each of the involved accredited programs and the clinical education setting and must document discussion of student capacity, supervision, and scheduling.

The JRCERT will not take any action on recognizing a facility as a clinical education setting for more than one educational program until documentation of such a meeting is submitted to the office. Although a face-to-face meeting is probably preferable, the format of the meeting is the prerogative of the involved parties. Teleconferencing or other formats are also acceptable.

### Degree Requirements

Considering pursuing a baccalaureate or master's degree to maintain compliance with the STANDARDS? Before deciding on an academic institution, do your research! Although the JRCERT does not mandate the area of study or concentration, the JRCERT does require the academic institution be accredited by an organization recognized by the United States Department of Education or the Council for Higher Education Accreditation.

## Questions & Answers

**Q** Due to the manpower shortage, my institution has decided to accept five more students this fall. We have sufficient classroom space but will need to apply for recognition of an additional clinical site to accommodate the increased capacity. Do I have to wait to assign students at that site until I've applied for recognition?

**A** Students should not be assigned to a new clinical education setting until the program has received notification from the JRCERT that the site is recognized. The application for recognition of a new site includes submission of the appropriately completed form (JRCERT Form 104), executed affiliation agreement, evidence of JCAHO or equivalent institutional accreditation, assignment of a qualified clinical instructor/supervisor/preceptor (JRCERT Form 102 plus current curriculum vitae and documentation of appropriate certification), and appropriate fee. Programs are generally notified within two months of receipt of a complete application for recognition.

**Q** I was recently informed that you cannot display dosimetry reports with the students' social security numbers or dates of birth. Our program currently posts our students' dosimetry reports in a location that is accessible to the general public. Does the JRCERT have any suggestions?

**A** While exposure reports are considered public information, birthdates and social security numbers should be protected as confidential information. If you use the Landauer Company you may call them at (708) 755-7000 and request this information be deleted from your forms. This service costs 35¢ a month.

**Q** Our program is currently providing courses to some of our students via tele-video conferencing. Does the JRCERT need to be notified of this?

**A** Consistent with JRCERT policy and procedures, the addition of courses that represents a significant departure in method of delivery such as videoconferencing or internet is considered a substantive change. The program must notify the JRCERT and submit a detailed plan describing implementation of the new curriculum delivery prior to program adoption.

## **ASRT Curricula**

In the Winter 2002 Review, the JRCERT discussed use of the recently revised ASRT curricula for radiography and radiation therapy. The article indicated that, consistent with language in each of the documents, the professional component was required and the general education component, identified as recommended, would not be required.

At the request of the chairs of the Radiography and Radiation Therapy Curriculum Project Groups, the JRCERT revisited this issue at the Spring 2003 meeting. Following discussion, the Directors re-affirmed their decision. Consistent with the language of the documents themselves, the JRCERT considers the general education components as recommended. Although programs are encouraged to include this material in their curriculum, it is not a requirement for JRCERT accreditation.

Programs are reminded, however, that all elements of the professional curriculum must be covered. Programs will have until August 2004 to comply with the new curricula.

## **Medical Dosimetry Accreditation Standards Adopted**

The Standards for an Accredited Educational Program in Medical Dosimetry were adopted by the Committee at its April 2003 meeting. The newly adopted standards have been posted on the JRCERT web site ([www.jrcert.org](http://www.jrcert.org)). The JRCERT thanks all of those who commented on the various drafts of the standards prior to their final adoption.

The medical dosimetry standards become effective January 1, 2004. JRCERT staff are currently developing complementary documents, i.e., the Guide for Program Analysis - MD, the Report of Site Visit Team Findings - MD, and other related materials.

Anyone with questions about the application process for accreditation of a dosimetry program is encouraged to call the office.

## **What HIPAA Means To You**

In 1996 Congress enacted the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA). Regulations went into effect April 1, 2003. Basically, the regulation protects the security and privacy of patient information and provides national standards for transfer of healthcare information. The regulations guarantee patient access to medical records and gives patients control of how their health information is used and disclosed. The health information unique to a patient, which by itself could identify the patient, such as date of birth, social security number, medical record number, and telephone number is referred to as protected health information (PHI). This information cannot be shared with others unless the patient explicitly gives permission.

So what does this mean to you and your program? It is the program's and clinical education settings' responsibility to assure that students understand policy and procedures related to HIPAA. Many clinical education settings are requiring educational programs to enter what is called a Business Associate Agreement. A Business Associate Agreement assures the clinical

education setting that if the program and/or the student comes into contact with a PHI, this information will be appropriately safeguarded. Because of the chances of a program attaining PHI are small, the JRCERT suggests programs seek advice from their legal counsel before entering a Business Associate Agreement.

Programs are encouraged to review all their clinical record forms to assure that they don't require PHI. (It is acceptable for forms to contain medical record numbers if the same form does not also contain the name of the clinical site.) Programs sending information to the JRCERT in support of a response to a report of findings or a progress report should not submit forms that contain PHI, e.g., if forms contain PHI, that information should be obscured.

During site visits, site visitors may be exposed to PHI in the process of obtaining sufficient information to document a program's compliance with accreditation standards. Site visitors should be sensitive to HIPAA issues and avoid specifically requesting information containing PHI and also use caution in reporting so as not to compromise PHI.

## **JRCERT Representatives to Meetings**

The JRCERT welcomes the opportunity to attend meetings of state and regional organizations of technologists and/or educators and students. JRCERT policy provides for JRCERT funding of such representation to an organization every other year.

As a condition of providing a representative, the JRCERT requires that the representative be provided with at least 50 minutes of program time for an educational presentation or open forum focused on JRCERT activities. If meeting organizers would like additional presentations regarding specific aspects of accreditation (e.g., outcomes assessment or an overview of accreditation standards) or continuing education sessions

in the representative's area of expertise (e.g., organizing effective clinical education or strategic planning), the JRCERT is willing to discuss the possibilities.

To request a representative, the organization should direct a letter to the JRCERT, preferably at least 6 months in advance of the meeting. The request should include the date and location of the meeting, the specific presentation(s) requested, and whether or not the session(s) is for continuing education credit. The organization can also request a specific staff member or Director. The JRCERT will endeavor to honor such requests as it is able.

## Accreditation Specialist Position Available in Chicago
