Dear Dr. Hurst:

After review of the requested interim report, the continuing accreditation status of the associate degree radiography program sponsored by Cleveland Community College was considered at the September 20, 2022 meeting of the Joint Review Committee on Education in Radiologic Technology (JRCERT). The JRCERT is the only agency recognized by the United States Department of Education (USDE) and the Council for Higher Education Accreditation (CHEA) for the accreditation of traditional and distance delivery educational programs in radiography, radiation therapy, magnetic resonance, and medical dosimetry. Specialized accreditation awarded by the JRCERT offers institutions significant value by providing peer evaluation and by assuring the public of quality professional education in the radiologic sciences. The program was evaluated according to the **Standards for an Accredited Educational Program in Radiography (2021)**. The JRCERT took the following action:

REDUCTION OF ACCREDITATION TO A PERIOD OF FIVE YEARS.

Consistent with JRCERT Policy 10.100, this accreditation action is not subject to appeal.

The Committee based this decision on the program's non-compliance with Standards Five and Six:

Objective 5.4 - The program assures that medical imaging procedures are performed under the appropriate supervision of a qualified radiographer.

The program is advised that the supervision policies must be made known to students, clinical preceptors, and clinical staff annually and documentation is to be maintained by the program.

Objective 6.2 - The program analyzes and shares its program effectiveness data to facilitate ongoing program improvement.

Objective 6.3 - The program has a systematic assessment plan that facilitates ongoing program improvement.

The program is also advised to assess graduate and employer satisfaction. The program is further advised to reevaluate the measurement tools and benchmarks utilized for the assessment plan to assure useful and reliable data is obtained.

Objective 6.4 - The program analyzes and shares student learning outcome data to facilitate ongoing program improvement.

Objective 6.5 - The program periodically reevaluates its assessment process to assure continuous program improvement.

The next site visit is tentatively scheduled for the Fourth Quarter of 2023. The continuing accreditation materials will be forwarded to the program at a future date and will include a submission timetable.

Consistent with JRCERT Policy 11.400, the maximum compliance timeframe is 36 months. Based on the areas of non-compliance, the Board of Directors are awarding a 24-month compliance timeframe. Therefore, the program must document compliance with all accreditation standards no later than **September 20, 2024**.

As required by the USDE and consistent with the **maximum** compliance timeframes set forth in JRCERT Policy 11.400, when the JRCERT Board of Directors determines that a program has failed to document compliance with the **Standards** and has not satisfactorily addressed the identified deficiencies, the existing accreditation status will be withdrawn. Such involuntary withdrawal of accreditation is considered an adverse accreditation action. The JRCERT defines an adverse action as involuntary withdrawal of accreditation. Involuntary withdrawal of accreditation will generally, but not necessarily, occur after a Probationary Accreditation status has been awarded. The Board may take adverse action prior to the expiration of the maximum compliance timeframe. Probationary status, as well as an adverse accreditation action, requires written notification to the United States Secretary of Education, the appropriate State licensing or authorizing agency, appropriate regional and/or other accrediting agencies, and the public.

Consistent with JRCERT Policy 11.500, the JRCERT has determined that program officials would benefit from a JRCERT-sponsored Outcomes Assessment Workshop. Documentation of the program director and/or clinical coordinator's attendance at an Outcomes Assessment Workshop must be submitted no later than **September 20, 2023**. A complete listing of dates and locations for all JRCERT-sponsored seminars and workshops is available at www.jrcert.org/events.

The program is lastly advised that consistent with JRCERT Policy 11.600, the JRCERT reserves the right to conduct unannounced site visits of accredited programs. The sponsoring institution would be responsible for the expenses of any on-site evaluation.
