After review of the additional progress report, the continuing accreditation status of the associate degree radiography program sponsored by Augusta Technical College was considered at the January 19, 2021 meeting of the Joint Review Committee on Education in Radiologic Technology (JRCERT). The JRCERT is the only agency recognized by the United States Department of Education (USDE) and the Council for Higher Education Accreditation (CHEA) for the accreditation of traditional and distance delivery educational programs in radiography, radiation therapy, magnetic resonance, and medical dosimetry. Specialized accreditation awarded by the JRCERT offers institutions significant value by providing peer evaluation and by assuring the public of quality professional education in the radiologic sciences. The program was evaluated according to the **Standards for an Accredited Educational Program in Radiography (2014)**. The program now documents compliance with all relevant Standards; therefore, the JRCERT awards:

EXTENSION OF ACCREDITATION FOR A PERIOD OF TWO YEARS.

This extension equates to an award of five years of accreditation effective from the date of the most recent site visit.

Consistent with JRCERT Policy 10.100, this accreditation action is not subject to appeal.

The next site visit is tentatively scheduled for the Fourth Quarter of 2023. The continuing accreditation materials will be forwarded to the program at a future date and will include a submission timetable.

The program is advised that consistent with JRCERT Policy 11.600, the JRCERT reserves the right to conduct unannounced site visits of accredited programs. The sponsoring institution would be responsible for the expenses of any on-site evaluation.
