JRCERT COVID-19 Site Visit and Social Distancing Guidelines

Participating individuals involved in a JRCERT accreditation site visit evaluation must adhere to the following guidelines as established by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

Social Distancing and Limiting the Spread of Infection:

- Cover your mouth and nose with a cloth face cover when around others
- · Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds
- If soap and water are not readily available, use a hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands

Expectations of the Program

- At no time during the onsite evaluation can the program's state regulation regarding the number of individuals allowed to gather at one time be exceeded
- Allow individuals to maintain 6 feet of distance from others
- Require the use of cloth face coverings for individuals coming to campus in accordance with state regulations, as applicable
- Assure frequently touched surfaces are cleaned and disinfected
- Be familiar with and abide by the latest state regulations regarding social distancing and social integration

Helpful Tips for Site Visitors:

- If possible, avoid mass public transportation services
- Self-monitor for symptoms: watch for fever, cough or shortness of breath
- Be prepared to adjust plans and notify the JRCERT office if a clinic setting's availability for visitors changes (i.e., allow for student and clinical instructor interview sessions to be moved to the school campus or virtually, if necessary)
- When working with the program to prepare the agenda, separate time between meals and interview sessions
- Conduct interviews inline with the program's state regulations
- If the state you are visiting does not have stringent regulations, feel free to practice the social distancing regulations of your state of residence
